As we begin a new year, we do so grounded in these experiences, carrying forward the belief that meaningful change is built steadily through everyday acts done with purpose.

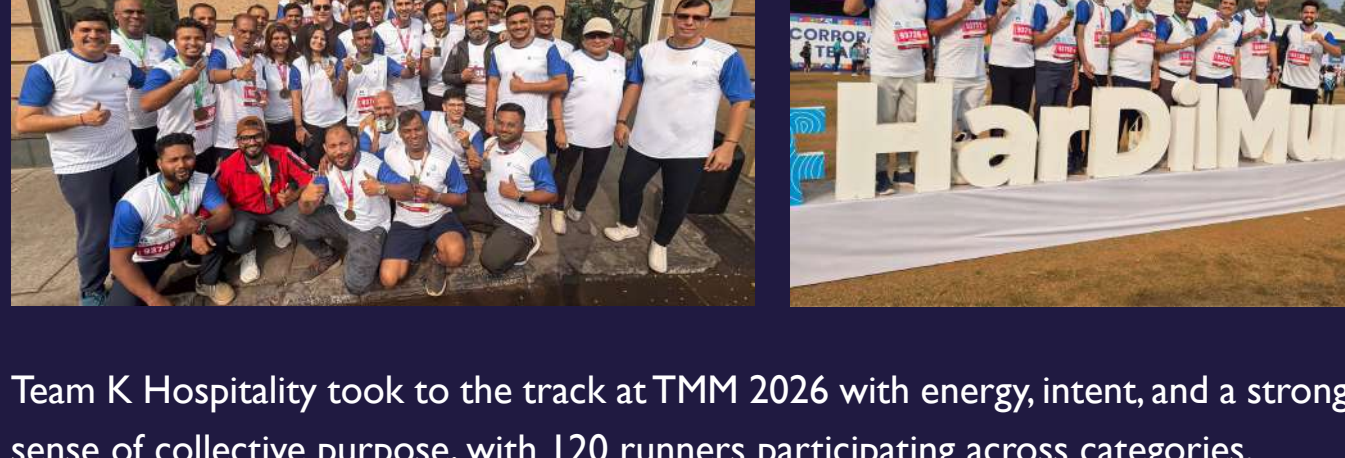
Let's keep the spirit of giving alive in 2026! Happy New Year!

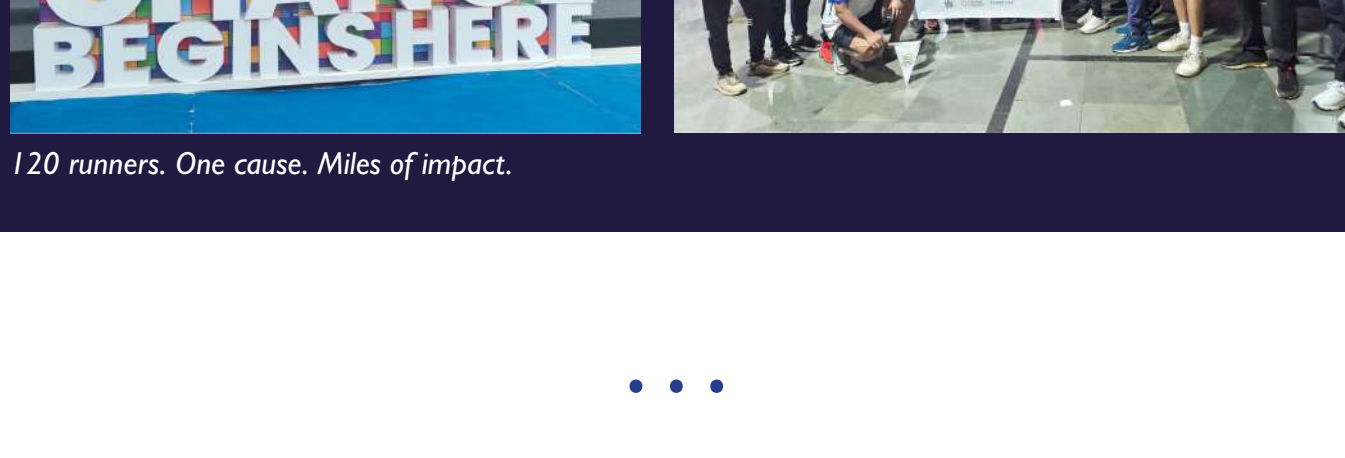


RUNNING WITH PURPOSE

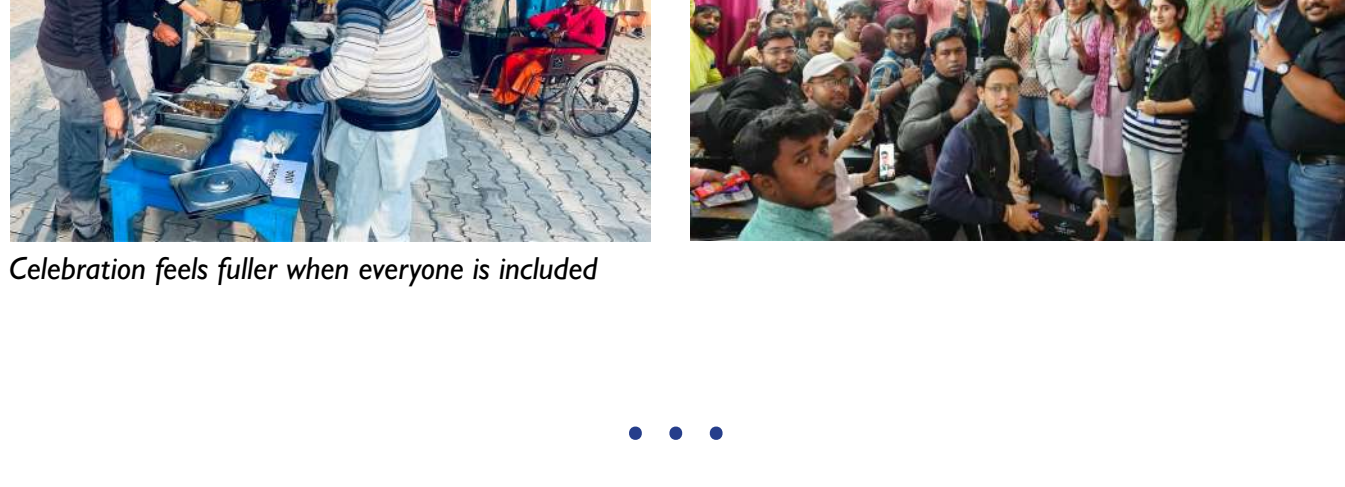
CHRISTMAS BEYOND OUR WALLS

From a lively Christmas carnival for children in Mumbai, to shared meals and essential grain donations in Bengaluru, Delhi, and Kolkata, the initiative reached families and individuals spending the season under challenging circumstances. In Goa, festive engagements with children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities were complemented by the donation of a water purifier, addressing a vital everyday need. At Una, nutritious meals and essential supplies supported individuals affected by leprosy and children in institutional care.

At its heart, Joy of Giving reaffirmed a simple belief: celebration becomes meaningful when it is shared with empathy and intention.



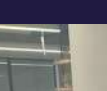

CLOTHES DONATION DRIVE

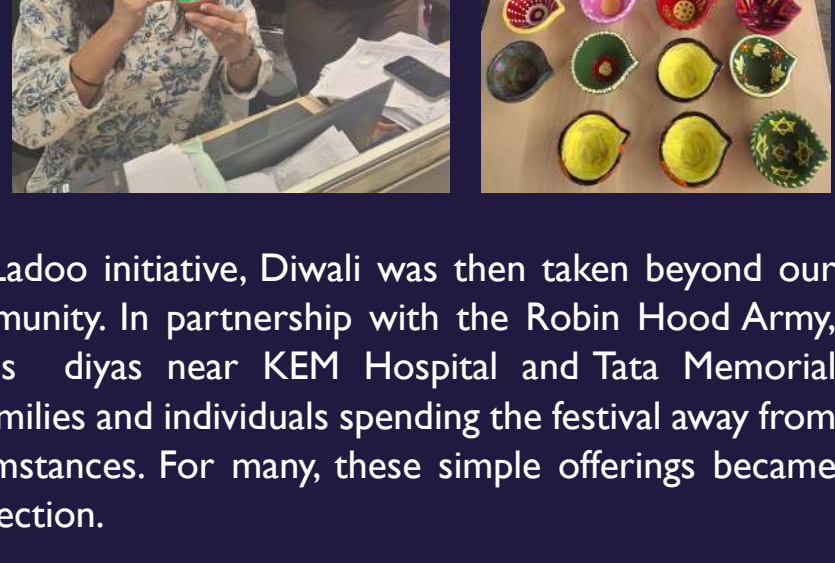
In partnership with Project Mumbai, a clothes donation drive was conducted to support circularity and responsible waste management. A total of 45 kg of clothing was collected for reuse and upcycling, reducing textile waste and extending the life of materials.

Items unsuitable for reuse were responsibly diverted for Co-processing in cement industries, where they were used for energy generation, ensuring minimal environmental impact and a zero waste outcome.

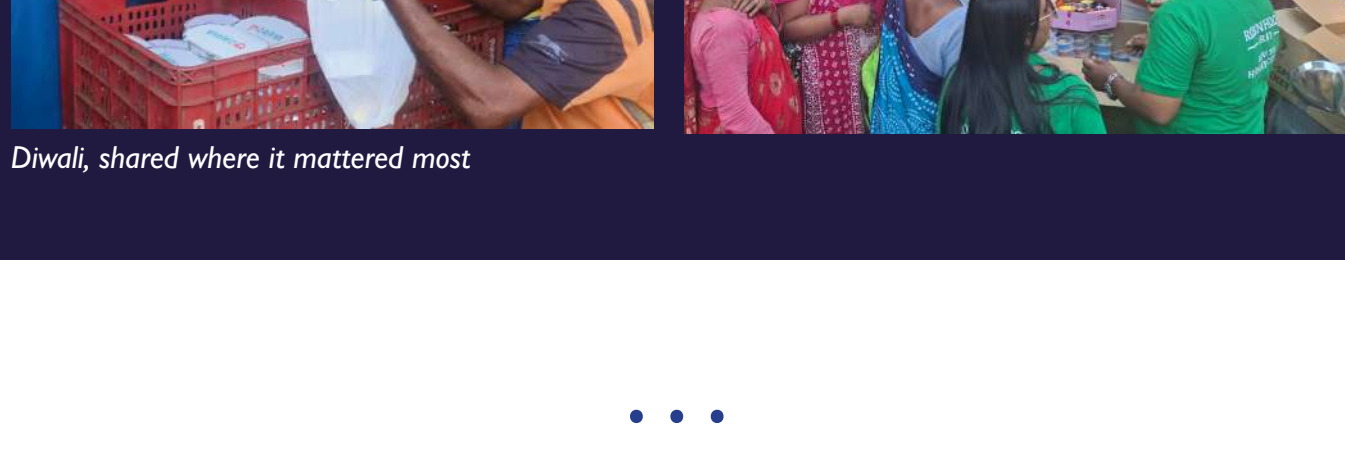


LOVE, LIGHT & LADOO

Diwali began a little earlier this year, with employees coming together for a diya painting activity that set a thoughtful tone for the celebrations ahead. Each hand-painted diya, carried intention and care, created with the purpose of sharing light beyond our own spaces.



As part of the Love, Light & Ladoo initiative, Diwali was then taken beyond our workplaces and into the community. In partnership with the Robin Hood Army, volunteers distributed laddoos and diyas near KEM Hospital and Tata Memorial Hospital in Mumbai, reaching families and individuals spending the festival away from home under challenging circumstances. COOKING KNOWLEDGE INTO CARE



Skills shared, foundations strengthened

In collaboration with United Way Mumbai, the Chefs for Good programme in Karjat focused on strengthening early childhood nutrition through hands-on learning. Young mothers participated actively, preparing nutritious, affordable recipes designed for children in the critical first 1,000 days of life.

Over 40 recipes were prepared during the session, with three recognised for their creativity and nutritional value, encouraging confidence and shared learning within the community. Chefs from Travel Food Services Limited, The Irish House, and K Hospitality Corp cooked alongside families, offering practical tips and simple techniques to enhance everyday meals for children aged 6 months to 2 years.



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
